I am directed to state that in the Government letter dtd. 1.12.87, cited above, the application of Sri Siddartha Education Society for sanction of new medical college for the year 1986-87 was not agreed to under sub-section(5) of section 53 of Karnataka State Universities Act 1976. Accordingly the Bangalore University issued orders vide its letter dtd. 2.12.87 cited above rejecting their application to start the medical college at Tumkur.

It may be stated in this connection that Sri Siddartha Education Society had filed a Writ Petition No. 1240/87 before the Supreme Court of India, New Delhi. The Supreme Court had issued orders on 6.1.88 as follows:

"Whatever may be the policy of the Government for the academic year 1987-88, the Government is directed to consider the question of grant of affiliation to the petitioner's society for the year 1988-89 giving due weight to the

fact that the petitioners' society is an institution of persons belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and also to the fact that the Local Inspection Committee and the Academic Council and the Syndicate of the University have recommended granting of such affiliation and the application in this behalf has been pending for about three years.

We clarify that it will not be necessary for the petitioner to make a fresh application for the academic year 1988-89.

In view of the aforesaid direction, the petitioners withdraw all the allegations made against respondents 5 and 6. The Writ Petition is disposed of accordingly with no order as to costs.

Subsequently the Supreme Court in CMP 12720 of-88 in Writ Petition No.1240 of 87 the Hon'ble Supreme Court has ordered on.10.5.88 as follows:

Heard learned counsel for the parties. We have perused the decision of the Government in the matter of affiliation of the petitioner to the proposed Medical College. Two conditions have been impressed:-

i) there should be no capitation in any form whatsoever  
ii) that hospital facility with sufficient beds should be available for the students. Mr.Potty, counsel for the petitioner, agrees that the petitioner would give undertaking to this Court within two weeks from today that no capitation fee in any form whatsoever shall be realised from the students who would be admitted into the college for the MBBS course. He also states that immediate steps shall be taken to construct the Hospital. Land is already earmarked, funds have already been set apart and construction work would start forthwith so as to provide hospital facilities by the time the students require to avail the same in course of their study. It is stated that a period of 15 months would be taken to build the hospital with adequate facilities. In view of the facts that the conditions imposed by the Government are acceptable to the petitioner, we direct that sanction be given subject to a further condition that when advertisement for filling up the seats is given, it would be stated that this college does not have existing hospital facilities but expects to have such facilities within 18 months. The State Government is directed to issue the sanction order within two weeks hence. The capacity of the institution should be 150 seats as in other colleges. It would also be mentioned in the undertaking that no extension for raising the hospital shall be asked for. The CMP is accordingly disposed of.

In the circumstances stated above, the State Government under sub-section(5) of section 53 of Karnataka State Universities Act 1976, recommend to the Bangalore University to sanction affiliation to Sri Siddhartha Education Society, Siddarthanagar, Tumkur for starting a 1st MBBS course for the academic year 1988-89 at Siddarthanagar, Tumkur district from June 1988, subject to the terms and conditions mentioned in and imposed by the Supreme Court order and subject to the condition that they should give undertaking as ordered by the Supreme Court in their order dtd.10.5.87.

Subject : Admissions in MBBS Course for the session 1996-97 & 1997-98.

Sir,

As you are aware the learned Division Bench of the Karnataka High Court, on 1st October, 1996, in Writ Appeal No. 8413 of 1996 had directed you to submit application under section 10 A to 10 C for fixation of the intake capacity for the admissions in the MBBS course by your college from 1996-97 & 1997-98 onwards. Pursuant to your application, the Council had carried out an inspection and had made the recommendations to the Central Government. On the due assessment of the inspection report, Council had recommended to the Central Government that your college can admit 130 (One hundred thirty only) students in the MBBS course.

That thereafter the Central Government has decided to permit you to admit 130 (One hundred thirty only) students in MBBS course.

The Hon'ble High Court by the final judgement and order dated 16th of July, 1997 has held that after 1-6-1992 it is for the Central Government to fix the intake capacity for the MBBS course on the basis of the recommendations of the Medical Council of India. You are therefore under an obligation to abide by and follow the above-mentioned intake capacity for the MBBS course in your college and it is obvious that you would not admit any student in the MBBS course over and above the above-mentioned intake capacity, which was so fixed by the Central Government, in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble High Court.

Sir/ Madam,

I am directed to convey the approval of Board of Governors of Medical Council of India for renewal of permission for admission of 3<sup>rd</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 130 to 150 at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for the academic Year 2012-2013. The Board of Governors has granted approval after consideration of the Assessment Report dated 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> February, 2012 submitted to Board of Governors of MCI. The Permission is, however, subject to the condition that admission process may be completed as per time schedule prescribed in the Regulations of Medical Council of India.

In addition to above, this is further to inform you that while making admissions of your college to MBBS course it shall be ensured that:

- (i) No admission is permitted beyond the sanctioned intake capacity;
- (ii) Selection of Students to the Medical College is in accordance with the requirements laid down in the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 1997;
- (iii) No admission is permitted beyond the cut-off date.

It shall be incumbent upon the Medical College that the information relating to admissions should be submitted within a fortnight of closure of admissions to the Council. Any failure to submit the information within this time limit would be construed that the admissions in the College were not in accordance with the statutory requirements, thereby enabling the Council to proceed in accordance with law against the College.

I am further directed to inform that you and your institution are fully responsible to fulfill and maintain norms including the infrastructure both physical and human resource, teaching faculty and clinical material, etc. throughout the academic year, as stipulated in Regulation of Medical Council of India. In case false/wrong declaration or fabricated documents have been used for procuring permission of the Board of Governors and the said misconduct is brought to notice or comes to the knowledge of MCI at any stage during the current academic year, your institution is not liable to be considered for renewal of permission for the increased intake for the next academic year and this renewal of permission for the increased intake is also liable to be revoked for current academic year. Besides, MCI is entitled to take all such measures against you and your college/institution as permissible under the law.



Sir,

I am directed to inform you that an assessment to verify the compliance submitted by the college authorities on the deficiencies pointed out in the earlier assessment report with regard to recognition/approval of Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Sri Siddhartha University, Tumkur against the increased intake i.e. from 130 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 was carried out by the Council assessors on 18.01.2019. The compliance verification assessment report (18.01.2019) alongwith the summary/observations of the Consultant (Undergraduate) was considered by the Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India and decided to recommend to the Central Government for recognition/approval of Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Sri Siddhartha University, Tumkur against the increased intake i.e. from 130 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16<sup>th</sup> April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) *The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.*

(3) *The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.*

(4) *Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute."*

In view of above, you are requested to issue necessary notification at the earliest recognizing Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for the award of MBBS degree when granted on or after January, 2015 by Sri Siddhartha University, Tumkur against the increased intake i.e. from 130 to 150 seats.




